made another remarkable partnership putting together 48 runs in the fifth wicket stand before Moeen Ali was bowled out by Mohammad Wasim when England was just six runs away from winning spot. Moeen Ali hit 19 of 12 balls including three fours.

Livingstone remained unbeaten with one run. Harris Rauf bagged two wickets in the space of 23 runs, while Shaheen Shah Afridi and Shadab Khan took one wicket apiece.

Earlier, Sam Curran played the key role to restrict Pakistan to a meek total. He captured three wickets instead of 12 runs. Curran was adjudged the Man of the Match. Adil Rashid and Chris Jordan bagged two wickets each for 22 and 27 runs respectively.

Opener Babar Azam and Shan Masood made the most valuable partnership. They contributed together 39 runs in the third wicket stand before Babar was caught & bowled by Adil Rashid when Pakistan's score was 84 for the loss of three wickets.

Babar made 32 from 28 balls featuring two fours. Shan Masood hit a superb 38. His 28-ball knock was studded with two fours and a sixer before Masood was victim of Sam Curran.

Shadab Khan hit a fine 20 from 14 balls with two fours. BBC adds Shaheen injury proves crucial

Pakistan - and the crowd - sensed their moment when, with 54 needed from 45, Harry Brook sliced leg-spinner Shadab Khan straight to long-off.

But in taking the catch Shaheen, who had bowled Ahsan Hales in England's first over, injured himself - a moment that proved crucial.

He returned to the field to bowl the 16th but after one delivery he limped off the field.

That left part-time spinner Iftikhar Ahmed to finish the over and Stokes took his chance, smacking a four through extra cover and a six over long-off to bring the game under England's control.

Moeen Ali followed by hitting seamer Mohammad Wasim for three fours in the next over and the result was all but secure, even though Moeen was bowled in the 19th over.

Pakistan's pace bowlers can take little blame. Harris Rauf had England captain Jos Buttler caught behind for 26 and Phil Salt taken at mid-wicket in a thrilling spell.

He and Naseem Shah, who somehow went wicketless in four sensational overs, did all they could to secure what would have been Pakistan's second T20 title.

Immense pride - reaction  
England captain Jos Buttler, speaking to BBC Radio 5 Sports Extra: "It hasn't sunk in at all obviously. What an unbelievable effort from everyone to win the game. I am a bit speechless.

"It feels really different to 2019. It was a different time, different place and a different group. I am just immensely proud. Both are just incredible.

England all-rounder Ben Stokes: "I feel really good. It has been an amazing night. The bowlers have to take credit for restricting them to 137. Sam Curran has done it all tournament and Adil Rashid has turned up at the back end of the tournament when it really matters. That was the best I've seen him bowl for England in a T20.

"I am very proud. You don't get to win World Cups too often so to win two of them is pretty special."

England head coach Matthew Mott: "It is very special for me. We wanted to turn up and put on a show and enjoy it. We'll enjoy tonight with the boys because we've put in a lot of work to get to this point."

Pakistan captain Babar Azam: "First of all congratulations to England. They deserve to be champions. We left at home. Everyone who has come to support us at every venue, thank you so much.

"The first two games we lost but the way the team bounced back was unbelievable, credit to my team."

hearing on behalf of the HRPB, while Deputy Attorney General Barrister Kazi Mayrul Hassan represented the state.

The court also issued a rule upon the concerned bodies of the government to explain in four weeks as to why their inaction in stopping illegal brick kilns across the country and in stopping use of woods as fuel in the brick kilns should not be declared illegal.

It also asked the Director General of the Department of Environment and Director and Divisional Commissioners of the department to form monitoring team within one week for their respective areas for the same purpose. They have also been asked to submit a compliance report over their steps within two weeks.

Manzill Murshid said, "Brick kilns cannot be established without license according to the Brick Kilns Establishment (Control) Act, 2013 and the law has a provision barring use of woods as fuel in the brick kilns. However, illegal brick kilns across the country have started their operations ahead of the winter season and those brick kilns have taken preparation to use woods as fuel, as per newspaper report."

through social media, he suggested the people not to pay heed to the rumours," he said.

It is also evident in the declining flow of deposits in the banks. The year-on-year net bank deposits have declined by 29 per cent from 2020-21 to 2021-22 fiscal year, according to the Bangladesh Bank.

Deposits in poor's bank accounts declined by 18.61 per cent in the second quarter ended in June 2022 compared with that in the same period of the last year.

The hard-core poor's deposits in bank accounts stood at Tk 201.37 crore at the end of June 2022 against Tk 238.84 crore at the end of June 2021, according to the Bangladesh Bank's quarterly report.

Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association.

The prime minister also called on Bangladesh's business leaders to welcome foreign investment, along with the technology and know-how it entails.

Highlighting the socio-economic strides taken by Bangladesh, she said, "The country's per capita income is increasing and now stands at \$2,824. The purchasing power is also increasing."

But the Awami League chief believes it is necessary to supplement exports by creating a market within the country.

With the fourth industrial revolution on the horizon, Hasina stressed the need to develop and diversify the country's workforce by embracing and promoting the use of technology.

Hasina urges global businesses to invest in Bangladesh.

"We have already started working on various measures to adapt to the fourth industrial revolution and its impact on the economy and employment prospects. The ready-made garment industry also needs to adopt augmented robotics technology, so we're preparing for it."

Hasina highlighted the need to develop the skills of workers both at home and abroad to keep pace with technological advancements. "We are providing training opportunities to them to become technologically proficient."

She also called on garment exporters to focus on increasing production and quality while ensuring a labour-friendly environment.

The week-long event, with the theme "Care for Fashion", kicked off at the Bangladesh International Conference Centre on Sunday. It will continue until Nov 18.

The event aims to promote and increase the market share of Bangladesh garment products in the international market. It will also provide an opportunity for trade partners across the global value chain to work together to address challenges.

Hasina also handed out special awards to four garment manufacturers in recognition of their special contributions to exports.

during Lavrov's visit Bangladesh would place the Rohingya issue before him and seek their active cooperation in resolving the crisis through negotiation.

"We have a number of Russian projects especially Rooppur Nuclear Power Plant. We will talk about it more seriously so that the plant is not hampered due to the consequences of western sanctions and counter-sanctions," he added.

Russia is one of the major dialogue partners of ICRA and Bangladesh has already invited Russia to attend the conference.

Even the Russian Foreign Minister is likely to have a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to talk on bilateral issues and cooperation.

Russia supported Bangladesh during the Liberation War in 1971 when the world was divided between two blocs - capitalism and communism.

Meanwhile, the discussion in the seminar focused on the need of broadening Bangladesh's bilateral ties with Africa, a region with vast natural resource bases, strategic importance, and economic prospects.

Aside from that, other important issues like trade and investment, climate vulnerability, labour migration, peacekeeping, technological and industrial cooperation, human resource and skills development caught the eyes.

In these challenging times, a country requires to diversify its foreign relations and Bangladesh has undertaken different measures to that end as far as relations with Africa are concerned.

Ambassador Kazi Imtiaz Hossain, Chairman of BISS, chaired the inaugural session and Major General Sheikh Faisal Hossain, Director General of BISS, delivered the welcome address.

Ambassador Masrur Bin Hossain, Secretary (East), Ministry of Foreign Affairs, was the keynote speaker on the occasion.
